

# VOTE ALEX ALLINSON

I'm Alex Allinson and four years ago I was honoured to be voted in as a Ramsey Town Commissioner for the first time. It's been a busy few years and I've learnt a lot about the way the town hall works, and the huge influence that Central Government has on it. There is still a lot to do, and I'm back asking for your vote again.

My wife, two kids and I moved over from London ten years ago, and have never looked back. We love the Island, and still feel Ramsey is one of the friendliest places we've ever lived. Local elections normally get a poor turnout, and I too feel a bit despondent about politics at the moment. Every week there is news of more cuts, job losses and price increases. One of the most important roles of the Commissioners is to make sure that your money is spent wisely. I am dedicated to making sure that rates stay low, that local people can see what they get for their money, that we encourage new businesses and shops in our town but more importantly protect the services and facilities we already have.

I'm standing again because there is a really important job to be done protecting and developing our town over the next four years. There will be challenges but also real opportunities to make it an even better place to live.

- ✓ **Low rates, fair rents and an efficient town hall that doesn't waste your money.**
- ✓ **A Marina from the Swing Bridge up to the Old Harbour to try and redevelop the quay side and bring more tourists to the town.**
