Priorities for Ramsey

Election Manifesto

- I want to see more investment in Ramsey, I am in favour of renovating our Pier and constructing a Marina. There needs to be more in Ramsey to attract people, more to see and do. Government should play an active role in bringing more entertainment to the town, Ramsey would benefit greatly from more venues where functions can be held and new entertainment complexes, similar to the Centenary Centre in Peel.

National Priorities

- All elected officials should contribute to their pensions.
- There needs to be more communication from Government. You have a right to know where the Government is spending your money and why it makes the decisions it makes. If I am elected I will make sure that I keep you informed throughout my term as your MHK, and make sure that I always listen to your views, not just once every five years.
